How to Get Started

1. Fill out a registration form and pick up your registration folder with your first 100 books reading log at the desk any time after January 2, 2016.
2. Check out some books! The library staff is here to help with plenty of recommendations.
3. Start logging your books on the log by coloring in a flower for each book read.
4. After you've completed a log, bring it back to the library and pick up the next one.
5. Remember that there is no end date – so do not feel rushed to read all 1,000 books right away. Enjoy the memories you are making with your child.

How many books a day do I need to read to reach 1,000?

Child's Age	Number of books to read per day (at the very least)
0	1
1	1
2	1
3	2
4	3

Can we count the same book multiple times?

Yes! Repeated reading is more than okay; it's encouraged! Hearing the same story multiple times can help children develop vocabulary skills, and knowing what to expect allows them to feel like part of the reading.

Do the books have to be from the library?

No, books from your personal collection can count as well. Books from other libraries, preschools, and even books heard at Story Time can count.

What is the 1,000 Books program?

This program is based on evidence that the more books children (ages 0-5) hear read to them, the more prepared they will be to learn and enjoy reading upon reaching kindergarten
